Have you ever read the genealogy of Jesus at the beginning of Matthew? It is quite something how everyone is "begatted." In those 17 verses there are quite a few names I recognize, like David, Abraham and Ruth. But there are lots I don't, like Ozias, Zorobabel and Sadoc. Among all those names are five women, including some "Bad Girls."

Imagine, Rahab, a harlot is in there. One of Jesus' ancestors was a prostitute? Wow! In our Thursday morning Bible Study we just finished reading *The Bad Girls of the Bible* by Liz Curtis Higgs and Rahab was one of the women we studied. She was one that Higgs referred to as being "Bad for a Season but not Forever." (For Rahab's story read Joshua chapters 2 and 6.)

The beauty of Rahab's story is that even though she was leading a life that was not exactly saintly, she had faith and was redeemed--redeemed to the point of being included in the priestly line which leads to the birth of Christ.

During this season of Advent Rahab's story is speaking to me in a new and amazing way. I must admit that I have judged someone who does things that I view as "unsavory" and probably being a harlot would be on that list. This story, in conjunction with some of the experiences I've had at Griffin Hospital, have caused me to really take a look at myself and how I view others. I realize how easy it is to judge someone else by their outward appearance or by their actions. What I have learned is that we do not know what is in someone else's heart or why someone might be doing something. So, instead of judging I am trying hard to show love and care. And instead of counting someone's mistakes or the wrongs I feel they have done to me I am trying hard to forgive. Likewise, I want to give people opportunities to live out their faith.

What an example God has given to us! God gave Rahab a chance to do the right thing when he sent "spies" who were really angels, messengers of God, to her and she helped them. God took a chance on her and she was then able to turn away from her former way of life.

I invite you to spend some time in prayer this month thinking about how God might be speaking to you. Has God taken a chance on you? Is God encouraging you to take a chance on someone else?

Health Notes by Carin Florin, Parish Nurse:


What is a Stroke and What are the Signs?

There are two types of stroke: ischemic and hemorrhagic. An ischemic stroke is caused by interrupted blood flow to one or more vessels by a clot in the brain and causes tissue-death due to lack of oxygen and nutrients. A hemorrhagic stroke is caused by a ruptured vessel and causes leakage of blood into the brain tissue. The most common causes of stroke are high blood pressure, high cholesterol levels, obesity, diabetes, atrial fibrillation, peripheral artery disease, atherosclerosis, and injury.

Detecting signs of stroke early is crucial to effective treatment. Signs of a stroke can be tingling or numbness of the face or extremities, especially on one side of the body; confusion; trouble speaking or understanding; light-headedness; difficulty walking; loss of balance; or severe headache with no known cause. If you notice any of these symptoms in yourself or another person, do not delay. Call 9-1-1 or seek medical treatment immediately. Timing is everything!


Stroke treatment for ischemic stroke needs to be started with four hours of the onset of the first symptom. In order for treatment to begin, the person needs to undergo diagnostic testing prior to receiving medication. There can be factors in the person's medical history that may contraindicate treatment (meaning, those medications cannot be given). If it is determined the person can receive treatment and is indeed having an ischemic stroke, the physician may order the administration of TPA (tissue plasminogen activator) to help break up the clot.

Reduce the factors that can cause stroke. Start smoking cessation if you use tobacco, maintain healthy weight, engage in moderate exercise, enjoy a healthy diet, and get regular physicals to detect any health issue that can increase risk. Live happy, live well, and love God!
