Let's face it; no one likes change, but as Heraclitus said "The Only Thing That Is Constant Is Change." It's one of our basic fears because when things change we are uncertain as to what to expect and not sure who or what is in control.

I encourage you to find positive ways to embrace change because it often is for our betterment and learning and growing. Just think about what it was like for you each time you transitioned, into a new class, a new school, a new job. Think about the times in your life when change meant a new spouse, a new child, more love.



Granted there are a lot of changes that also have brought heartache, like the death of that spouse, a change in your ability to work, downsizing as those children left the nest.

We don't always like the change but we often can see the value. We want our children to succeed in life and as hard as it is to see them leave we know in our hearts that is better for them in the long run.

We will be making some changes in our worship over the course of the next few months. Some people may like the changes and others not so much. The worship committee's hope is that through the changes we will create new and fresh worship experiences in order to enhance our relationship with Christ. If we sing a song that you do not particularly care for look around and see if someone else is touched by it. It may not be your cup of tea but if it is bringing another person into a deeper relationship with God then we must all rejoice.

We are trying to be thoughtful about the changes we are making and will continue to use resources such as the Worship Design Studio by Rev. Marcia McFee and preaching books by Rev. Adam Hamilton. We will then spend time evaluating the changes to determine if in fact they are of value.

Last year during Lent we prayed the Lord's Prayer in different ways. Sometimes we become complacent in our habits and we end up reading the scripture, praying the prayers or singing the hymns without much thought just because this is what we have done all along. Altering words or placement of things will sometimes jolt us out of that and give us cause to think about what we are doing and what Jesus wants us to do.

May our worship be pleasing to God and may it nourish our souls.






## Susan's Garden at Webb Mountain Discovery Zone

## MISSIONS

#### Birthing Kits

Every year we make as many birthing kits as we can to send down to annual conference. The kit consists of a three foot square of heavy clear plastic, 3 twelve inch pieces of string, a small bar of soap, a pair of rubber gloves, a single edge razor blade and two receiving blankets in a plastic bag. We also send conference a dollar for every kit to help with the shipping. They are sent to areas where no doctors or clean facilities are available. These kits are all that these women have to help insure a safer delivery.

#### Mercy Learning Center

This wonderful non-profit group helps women in the greater Bridgeport area gain the knowledge they need to help pull themselves and their families out of poverty. Currently they have almost 900 women enrolled in various kinds of learning. Offerings include English, reading, parenting, household finance, a pathway to a high school diploma, assistance to go on to college and many other skills. We have an ongoing collection of toddler clothes, diapers, etc. to help support the free day care center they provide for students while they are attending classes. We held a shower last spring for the day care center and are planning on making this an annual town-wide event. We regularly deliver all contributions to Mercy Learning Center. Tutors and volunteers are always welcome.

#### St. John's Family Center

This wonderful mission has a free clothes closet available on Monday, Wednesday and Friday for the needy in the Bridgeport area. We regularly deliver donated clothes & shoes to them. They accept all clean usable clothing & shoes for men, women & children. The women attending Mercy Learning Center come here for appropriate clothing for job interviews, etc.

#### **United Congregational Thrift Shop**

Other items that are donated are brought here to help this church provide household items, etc. at an affordable price to the needy in the area. The money is then used to help them provide assistance to the needy.


