March 1st we will worship together for Ash Wednesday, marking the first day of Lent, the 40 days, excluding Sundays, that lead to Easter. According to *The United Methodist Book of Worship* we are encouraged "to observe a holy Lent: by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word." So, what exactly does that mean, to "observe a holy Lent" and how might we do it this year?

The good and bad news is there is no one right way. I can't prescribe you the proper amount of time to pray, fast and read. Instead, I encourage you to find your own way of contemplating your relationship with Christ, the places in your life where you've sinned and the ways you put the world before God.



So, although I don't have a magic solution for you to use to get right with God I do have some suggestions that may work for you:

- Fasting: Be it from social media, watching the news at dinner or refraining from eating dessert: fasting should not just be about giving something up but about either using that time or money to spend refocusing away from distractions and back toward God.
- Bible reading: Pick up the most recent copy of The Upper Room Daily Devotional Guide at church. Set aside time each day to read this. It provides a scripture passage and thought-provoking and spirit-enriching material to read and think about. Or attend our Thursday morning Bible Study.
- Prayer: Lent is a great time to intentionally work on your prayer time. Try praying at a different time of the
 day, try praying while walking, take home the bulletin each Sunday and pray the prayers there as well as lift
 up those on our prayer list.
- Service: Lent isn't just about sitting alone, it can also be about doing the work of Christ. Volunteer at the Monroe Food Pantry or at church, make an extra financial contribution to one of our mission projects or visit one.
- Rest: Sabbath is something we all struggle with given our busy lives. You don't need to put aside an entire
 day, start by spending time during an ordinary day to be still in God's presence. Instead of eating lunch in
 front of the computer, take your lunch outside and listen to the birds.
- Learning: Attend our Thursday evening Book Study or read a theological book. Listen to a podcast about Lent or about the history of Methodism.
- Worship: Decide to not only attend Ash Wednesday service but all Sundays in Lent. If you have to miss one go to our website and read the sermon as well as the weekly inserts. Invite someone to attend church with you too.

Whatever you choose to do this is your time to move along in your Christian journey. Whether you are new to the faith or a cradle Methodist use this 40-day journey as an opportunity to grow in your faith. Observe a holy Lent and open yourself up to a time of self-discovery. Bring someone along with you and behold the blessings!




