Now that it is getting warmer outside it is perfect time to get out and help someone else. Let's put our gifts to good use by "doing all the good we can" like John Wesley exhorted us.

We have a lot of exciting mission opportunities occurring during the month of May, so hop on board and join us! (See inside the newsletter for more information)

- May 4<sup>th</sup> is National Day of Prayer -- join with others from Monroe at the Town Hall Gazebo at noon as we pray for our community, our nation and our world.
- May 6<sup>th</sup> is our Shredding Event -- we have tons of fun while shredding tons of documents; we also need bakers for goodies. The free will donations go towards our Waterman Scholarship Fund.
- May 7<sup>th</sup> is the CROP Walk -- walk with us or sponsor a walker (the author of this article and her daughter are walking, hint hint).
- May 14<sup>th</sup> is Mother's Day -- purchase a blanket in honor or memory of a special woman and another woman somewhere in the world will be given warmth, shelter and comfort.
- May 20<sup>th</sup> is Game Night and Sandwich Making -- sign up to donate supplies and/or come and make sandwiches. Spooner House, the receipt of our sandwiches, has also asked for produce. Pick up an extra bag of apples next time you're at the grocery store! Then stay for lots of fun as we play all sorts of games.

• We will also be collecting supplies to make UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Health Kits during the month of May, which I will bring to the New York Annual Conference in June, which will be delivered to people all over the world. We find it is easier to collect the materials and put the kits together as a group, which the Friendship Circle will do the first Monday in June. A collection box will be in the narthex for donations. Here is what is needed for one kit (so donations of packs of combs, hand towels, toothbrushes, etc. are extremely helpful):

#### 1 hand towel

- 15 x 25 inches to 17 x 27 inches
- Kitchen, cleaning, and microfiber towels not acceptable

### 1 washcloth

#### 1 comb

- Comb needs to be sturdy and longer than 6 inches long
- No pocket combs or picks please
- Rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable with a minimum of 6 inches of teeth

### 1 metal nail file or nail clippers

No emery boards, please

#### 1 bath-size soap

- 3 oz. and larger sizes only
- No Ivory or Jergens soap due to moisture content
- Do not remove from original packaging

#### 1 toothbrush

- Adult size only
- Do not remove from original packaging

### 6 adhesive bandages

- ¾ inch to 1 inch-size
- Common household Band-Aids

#### 1 plastic bag

- One-gallon size sealable bag only
- \$1.00 to purchase toothpaste
- \$1.00 for shipping for each kit

The CWS Blankets+ Program recognizes that the smallest, simplest things can make a major difference in the daily life and future of adults and children worldwide. Blankets+ helps to provide blankets, tents, and other shelter items (as well as small tools such as seedlings, water pumps, basic farm implements, sewing machines, training, etc.). In 1946, in the aftermath of World War II, U.S. Christians joined hands and hearts in response to Jesus' call to feed the hungry,



quench the thirsty, and shelter the homeless children of God. Then and now we can do together what no one group can hope to do as well alone. Today, CWS is a cooperative ministry of 37 Protestant, Orthodox, and Anglican denominations, providing sustainable selfhelp and development, disaster relief, and refugee assistance in partnership worldwide. 




