Our "famous" apple crumb pies that have been made annually for over 40 years by members of the congregation will also be for sale. Live music will be provided to keep us in the spirit!

Below are some important dates to post on your refrigerator or phone app to stay "in the know" about all that needs to be done!

**Apple Pie Donations** Wednesday, September 6 deadline (This is a change from previous deadline). Items need to be in the kitchen so the "crumb" crew can perform their magic! **Apple Pick Up** Friday, September 15. The bushels of apples need to be picked up at Beardsley's Farm on Route 110 in Shelton and delivered to the church. A larger vehicle and strong arms are recommended as those bushels are big and heavy!

**Pie Making** Saturday, September 16 from 8:00 am – noon"ish". Peelers, slicers, runners, assemblers and clean up all needed. All ages always welcome. Come for coffee and fellowship while you work!

**Pork Pulling** Friday, September 15 and Saturday, September 16 beginning at 9:00 am. Quintin will also need help in transporting meat from the smoker at his home to the church on Thursday evening September 14 and Friday evening September 15. The actual time will be determined closer to the date.

*Chair Moving* Sunday, September 24. Right after worship, all chairs to be moved to altar area. We are currently arranging for floor waxing while chairs are out of the way.

**Sanctuary Set Up** Thursday and/or Friday, September 28 or September 29. The tables, chairs and lights will need to be arranged. We'll pick the night that has more people available to help.

Used cell phones can also be recycled for our service men and women and left in the same box.














## Take me out to the ballgame ...




## Outdoor Worship at Webb Mountain Discovery Zone




