Every year I say the same thing, yes, we just put away the Christmas decorations and now it's time to contemplate Jesus' death. He's been barely with us as a baby for a month and all of a sudden it's Lent. Yet, here we are ... Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th. Yes, Valentine's Day ... kind of a neat way to start, because God's love really is for us all. There is love in the ashes.

So, what can you do this Lent to strengthen your relationship with the one who died for you? It's a tradition to give something up for Lent, like chocolate, playing online games or snacking between meals. I encourage you to still do that but to also do something for someone else. If you give up chocolate, how about donating the chocolate you would have bought to our service personnel? If you give up playing online games, how about donating the time that you would have played to the Monroe Food Pantry? If you give up snacking between meals how about giving the money you would have spent on those snacks to UMCOR?

But here is the catch this year...do it in "secret." Don't make a big production of what you are doing as to bring glory to yourself. I have definitely been guilty of tooting my own horn in the past. I remember once when I was fasting on Wednesdays during Lent and I made sure everyone around me knew what I martyr I was...not exactly the purpose I don't think!

The sixth chapter of Matthew outlines what Jesus is calling for us to do: pray, give to the poor and fast, but the caveat is that we are to do it in secret. So, your mission, if you choose to accept it this Lent is to do something for someone but don't let them know you are doing it. (Of course if you volunteer somewhere the people there will know – but don't go around publicizing it to others.)

This will bring immense pleasure to God and will bring you closer to Him. Imagine how much better our little part of the world would be if we each did something each day for 40 days for someone else.

Give it a try - but don't tell me!




