Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As I write this newsletter article, Christmas is only about two months away. People everywhere are thinking about what to buy for their loved ones. Of course, their budget has much to do with the presents they give, so, the first step in gift-giving is planning the budget. We need to know what we can afford to spend before we can plan what gifts we will buy.

The church is working hard to be good stewards of the resources our members have provided. There is no waste in our budget, but we continue to look for ways to bring our monthly expenses more in line with our current level of giving.

The scripture quoted above is the response of Jacob after being visited by the Lord in a dream. All we have is from God who asks ten percent in return for all that God does for us. Our God is extremely generous with us, and yet, the average giving from United Methodists is about two percent. Giving is a spiritual matter; the greater our level of spirituality, the greater our giving tends to be. Beginning to tithe all at once is difficult for most families, but working closer to tithing each year is doable. Please spend time in prayer as you consider what your gift will be, and give generously to your church. May our God, who provides all that we have, continue to bless you abundantly.

Church Conference - October 14

The October 14 church conference unanimously approved the *Sale of Land Capital Project*.

Summary of Proposal

Currently, the UMC Monroe property is approximately 15 acres, comprised of two plots, the church building of approx. 6 acres and the parsonage of approximately 9 acres. The proposal is to subdivide the parsonage lot into three smaller lots: 1 lot for the parsonage and 2 additional lots that would be sold. The blueprints were developed in 1974 as part of the original building plans. The UMC Monroe will retain the church lot of approximately 6 acres and the smaller parsonage lot of approximately 3 acres.

The UMC Monroe will seek a short-term loan using the land as collateral. The loan proceeds will be used to pay off our two existing loans, and pay for engineering and survey work to subdivide and get the new lots ready to sell. Once the land is sold the proceeds will be given to the trustees to pay off the short-term loan with additional proceeds used for capital projects.

The plan was adopted by Church Council in April, presented and approved by the Land and Use sub-committee of the New York Annual Conference in September.



Make a Joyful Noise with Handbells

If you step into the music room on Wednesday nights from 7:15 - 8:15 pm, you'll hear the recently formed *UMC of Monroe Handbell Choir* rehearsing its upcoming music for the November and December services.

Our recently formed handbell choir has 11 members. The three-octave set of handbells come from Unity Hill Church of Christ in Trumbull who let us borrow their bells because they weren't using them.

The music we play looks like piano music with chords and notes across the treble and bass clefts. Each person plays two to four bells – each representing one note. The high notes are rung on smaller and lighter bells. The bass notes are played on larger bells,

weighing as much as 25 pounds. Players usually wear gloves to protect the finish on the bronze bells, which can get tarnished, or even pitted, from contact with oils produced by human skin.

Playing the bells takes teamwork in order to sound like one instrument that moves nice and smooth, like fingers running up and down a keyboard. Not only do you have to know what you're doing, but you have to know what your neighbor is doing, and how you fit into the whole mix. It's the ultimate team sport where you rely on people on either side of you to achieve that fantastic musical result.



Our handbell choir will be playing on Stewardship and Laity Sunday, which is November 18th, the first Sunday of Advent on December 2nd, and at our Christmas Eve Service. Please join us in worship as we rejoice and make happy bell noises as our way or praising God.


A.C.T.S Prayer Group

"Prayer is a way we become aware of and experience God's presence and character.

Through prayer, we meet and connect with God."

Prayer is essential to our lives as Christians, and for our church. Through prayer, we become stronger. Where two or three are gathered, great things happen! One of the best ways to improve in prayer, is to do it in community. On Thursday mornings from 11:30-Noon our church has a Prayer Group that meets. We are essentially following the ACTS Prayer model. The ACTS method of Christian prayer goes like this:

- Adoration: Give God praise and honor for who he is as Lord over all.
- Confession: Silent confession of our sins (God knows the details).
- Thanksgiving: Verbalize what you're grateful for in your life and in the world around you.
- Supplication: Pray for the needs of others and yourself.








