Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin root which means "coming." Since the fifth century CE., Christians have used the four weeks leading up to Christmas to not only prepare for the Christmas season, but to reflect on the meaning of the coming of Christ. Advent is a time of penitence and preparation. It is a time when we look back on how we, as Christians, have lived our lives over the past year. Have we lived in such a manner as to please God? Have we lived up to the vows made at our baptism ... at our confirmation ...when we joined the church? Advent is a time to examine our lives from a Christian perspective and to make adjustments that will enable us to answer yes to these questions. Advent is the start of a new church year. The birth of Christ signals a new beginning. I encourage you to make a new beginning in your relationship with God.

Attendance at Sunday services always swells around Christmas and Easter and then drops off after the festivities come to an end. While attending seminary, I read a book in which the author related a story where he asked the pastor why so many people only attend church around Christmas and Easter. The pastor's response, "Because those are the only stories they know." The pastor implied that people are uncomfortable being in church when they don't know the "story of the day." Well, there is only one way to get to know the stories, and that is to study the Bible.

In the coming year, our church will be focusing on two areas in which all Christians need to grow: Bible study and prayer. We currently have two Bible studies. One meets on Thursday mornings at 10:00, and the other meets Saturday mornings at 9:00. Our prayer group meets on Thursday mornings at 11:30, immediately following the Bible study. I would love to get a nighttime prayer group started as well. Please let me know if you are interested. Everyone is welcome, and encouraged, to attend any of these groups. Let's all use this season of Advent to prepare for life as a follower of Christ. May you experience God's abundant peace and blessings now and throughout the coming year.

Our UMC Monroe's very own, Paul Lesko, detailed opportunities available to volunteer at the Monroe Food Pantry and told us about his efforts to help there. The Missions Sunday service was a wonderful reminder of the many ways there are for us to share God's love by serving others in need.

Bridgeport Rescue Mission Great Thanks Giving Project

This year our congregation was invited to participate in the Bridgeport Rescue Mission's Great Thanks Giving Project event. The six-day event is held each November in the week leading up to Thanksgiving at Webster Bank Arena in Bridgeport. It is the Rescue Mission's largest event each year serving approximately 3,200 families who receive coats and/or a frozen turkey with other food items for their Thanksgiving meal. Our church participated in the coat drive collecting 113 pounds of coats, hats, scarves, gloves, socks, and other cold weather clothing items. During the event, the concourse of the arena is filled with racks of approximately 15,000 coats in various sizes for men, women, and children. As families arrive, they are paired with a "personal shopper" volunteer to assist them in finding up to 10 coats to meet their family's needs for the winter season. After selecting their coats, the families have an opportunity to share a moment of prayer with volunteers from area churches. UMC of Monroe had several volunteers participate this year as part of the Prayer Team offering blessings for the families. It was a special and meaningful experience to be part of the event. Thank you to all who donated coats and other items to keep our neighbors warm this winter season.


### The Mitten Tree


