
#### Dear friends:

I've just returned from the Bishop's Convocation where clergy members of the New York Annual Conference gather each year for fellowship and education. The Bishop brought in Tod Bolsinger, author of *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory.* In the book, Bolsinger compares the expedition of Lewis and Clark to being a leader in the Christian Church today. When Lewis and Clark reached the headwaters of the Missouri River, they discovered that their expectations for the terrain were completely wrong. Instead of a navigable river flowing to the Pacific Ocean, they found the Rocky Mountains, which stood in their way and were nothing like the mountains they had previously known. They were in uncharted territory and needed to adapt their leadership and learn new skills if they were to succeed in their mission.

Like all other denominations, the United Methodist Church is now in uncharted territory. The societal landscape has changed. We need to adapt and learn new leadership skills if we are to succeed in our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ. As Bolsinger states in his book, "The world in front of you is nothing like the world behind you." Our world has changed significantly. The old ways of leadership in the Church are not working today, and we need to adapt and change. "In uncharted territory," writes Bolsinger, "adaptation is everything." We have to be able to adapt to the new environment in which we find ourselves.

I write this to you because leadership in the church involves everyone, not just the pastor. We all play a part in leading The United Methodist Church of Monroe into the future. We all remember the "good old days" when the pews were full and the budget wasn't a constant concern, but if we are constantly looking back, we will run into something. As Bolsinger writes, we need to "Focus on the mountains ahead, not the rivers behind." Let us all put our trust in God, focus on the future of our church and our denomination, and not be afraid to make the changes that are required for us to grow into our future together.
