#### Dear friends:

This has been an unusual winter, weather-wise. Until the polar vortex hit in late January, the winter seemed to be warmer than usual. We have experienced both record highs and record lows as we have had some wild temperature swings. Through January, we had very little snow, but, so far, February has not disappointed us. We have finally received enough snow to brighten an otherwise dreary landscape.

Just as our weather goes through cycles of warm and cold, our faith can too. Bad weather makes sleeping-in on Sunday morning seem more appealing, but it really just cools our faith and makes God feel more distant. But certain events help to warm us up, baptisms and confirmations. They make us think about our faith commitment and where we stand in our relationship with Almighty God. Certain seasons in the church year also warm us up. Christmas and Easter stir us and move us to participate more.

Early Christians felt that the magnitude of the Easter celebration called for special preparation. Their preparation included fasting, which was more than just abstaining from food and water. Fasting was accompanied by frequent and sustained prayer. The person who fasted did so with the intention of seeking a deeper relationship with God. Although fasting is still practiced today, many people favor a modified fast which we call, "giving up something for lent." This practice also should be done with the intention of seeking a deeper relationship with God. If we give up something, and pray each time we feel the pangs of self-denial, we can indeed draw closer to God.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday which falls on March 6<sup>th</sup> this year. We will have a worship service that evening at 7 pm. Our Holy Week services will be Maundy Thursday and Good Friday with both services starting at 7 pm.

May God help us all to fight off the cold, and to use the forty days of Lent to stoke the fires of our faith. I pray that each of you will feel the warmth of a close personal relationship with your Lord and Savior this Lenten season.



#### **ASP Youth Mission Project**

Making homes warmer, safer, and drier



ASP stands for Appalachia Service Project. It is a Christian based ministry founded by a United Methodist Pastor! This year, the non-profit organization celebrates its 50<sup>th</sup> year. Since it began, ASP has helped 18,247 families!

We are excited to share with you that UMCM will be sending a mission team of youth and adult volunteers to ASP this summer from July 13<sup>th</sup> – July 20<sup>th</sup>! The group will spend every day (Monday through Friday) completing emergency repairs on homes of people caught in economic despair.

Open to anyone 14 years old and up (13 year olds may attend if they have completed 8<sup>th</sup> grade), ASP builds relationships, faith, and servant hood, while repairing homes for low-income families and individuals in North Carolina, Tennessee, Kentucky, West Virginia, and Virginia. Last year over 16,231 volunteers served with ASP, providing critical repairs for 493 families and constructing over 60 new homes!

What is truly amazing about this ministry, is our youth get tangible ways to be Christ's hands, doing Christ's work, by being in service to people who really need their help. It's a wonderful opportunity for putting faith into action by loving others in the way Jesus taught us to love.

In the coming months, the ASP team will be fundraising as the cost per person is \$800. If you would like to make a donation, please make checks payable to PUMC Seeds of ASP.



Thursdays, March 7 - April 11, 2019


