Dear Friends:

Yesterday, June 16th we celebrated Youth Sunday. We had 16 youth present and all took part in the service. It was the best Youth Sunday I have ever attended. What a blessing! The youth each received a certificate or a book mark to remind them of what they studied this year. Each Sunday school class gave a presentation. They recited the Apostles' Creed and the Lord's Prayer. And of course, they led us in singing *Jesus Loves Me*. We also recognized the efforts of our teachers and youth group leaders who work with our youth from the nursery all the way through high school, and helped to put together this wonderful celebration. They do a phenomenal job each week. Be sure to thank them for their efforts.

One of the parts that I found particularly meaningful, was the presentation by Juliana Epstein and Cooper Rupp. Cooper portrayed God and Juliana a young woman who was praying the Lord's Prayer. As Juliana was praying, "God" kept interrupting, first by acknowledging that He was there, but then by encouraging her to think about the words she was saying. "God" guided her to find peace with a problem she was having and helped her to understand the importance of prayer in her life. Not just doing it, but meaning what she was saying and listening to what God was saying to her.

Prayer is one of the most important things that we can do as a Christian. God wants a personal relationship with each one of us, but a relationship is not possible if we never talk to each other. The Gospels tell us that, before every major event in his life, Jesus prayed. The Church was founded on prayer. The first Disciples adopted Jesus' habit of praying, not only before every major event, but daily, and most likely, many times each day. When the Holy Spirit came upon them at Pentecost, the were gathered together in one place. When they gathered together, they prayed together, just like we do in worship each Sunday. But most of their prayers must have been lifted up when they were alone. That is the time most of us are open to hearing God's response to us. We were created with a need to know and communicate with our God. Prayer is the medium for that communication. We all need to talk to God often, and always take the time to listen for His response. This year more than ever, we need to keep our denomination, our church, and each other in our prayers.

Many thanks to our teachers and assistants who made this all possible. It was a great celebration and one of the best messages was delivered by two of our young adults. It was Isaiah who said, "...And a little child shall lead them." And they did.



Our kits will be added to hundreds of other kits donated by the many churches that make up our conference. High fives all around for everyone that contributed or assembled (and delivered) the kits! These kits will be distributed by UMCOR after a natural disaster anywhere in the United States.

This year, our Conference received 4,542 hygiene kits and more than 200 clean-up buckets were collected and delivered to Mission Central following this year's Annual Conference. As an aside, people will sometimes ask, Do these things really get to where they are intended? In response, the answer is, Yes!

AND speaking of UMCOR, our congregation raised \$400 to help our neighbors in Mozambique recovering from the spring cyclones.
