IN CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS ...

On November 15, several church members attended a **COMBINED CO-OPERATIVE PARISH MEETING** with Bishop Bickerton at Westville UMC in Hamden. The meeting consisted of the various churches in both the Greater Bridgeport Parish (of which we are part of) and the Elm City Bible Moths Parish. All in attendance were given the chance to offer input and suggestions as to what the NYAC might do to better assist our district. The session also included the Bishop reassuring all that "we are in this together" and he would be guiding us through the upcoming months.

Then on December 8, laity traveled to our **ANNUAL CHARGE CONFERENCE** (combined with several other churches in the area) at the Westport/Weston UMC with Rev. David Piscatelli (of Nichols UMC) presiding. The pastor's salary, the proposed 2020 budget and the lay leadership report were all unanimously approved, as well as Rebecca Denike and Carin Florin being voted in as Trustees, Class of 2022. The full charge conference report is available online - just call the church office. Many thanks to those that will be serving in leadership positions, as well as all committee members.

The **TASK FORCE** held their final session on December 10 under the direction of Rev. Ed Horne. Although, Pastor Ed Dayton had been appointed as our part time pastor prior to the final meeting, there was positive discussion as to where does UMCM go from here. What can we do to be a vital congregation? What needs do we need to fill? Everyone is encouraged to participate and offer their thoughts and suggestions. With the reduction to part time pastor, the **PARSONAGE IS NOW AVAILABLE FOR RENT TO THE PUBLIC**. Lastly, the **TRUSTEES** will be meeting on Monday, January 13 at 7:00 pm to further discuss the subdivision and sale of the vacant land. This matter was put on hold last summer until we were better informed of how we would be moving forward in the appointment of a new pastor.



Kairos Outside



The purpose of Kairos Outside is to demonstrate God's grace and love through Christian support for women who have relatives/friends who are or have been incarcerated. The goal is to provide a safe place to encourage the sharing of one's life journey, to create an opportunity for a relationship with God, and to promote participation in Support Groups.

Kairos Torch



Kairos Torch is a mentoring program for incarcerated offenders, ages 25 and under. The Weekend introduces incarcerated youth to Christian concepts as a means of making better choices for their lives. The Weekend is then followed with an established six-month one-to-one weekly mentoring program that encourages the youth to remove their masks and see themselves as God sees them.


