A message from Liz (June, 2020) ...



Church Council Update

Church Council held two "Zoom" meetings in May and both were very well attended!

Some highlights:

- 1. By majority vote the Council approved the recommendation of the Finance Committee to apply for the "Paycheck Protection Plan" (PPP) in order to continue to keep our employees paid during this time of uncertainty. Paperwork was completed and submitted to Newtown Savings Bank and the loan was approved. Any questions on this matter can be directed to Finance Chair. Bill Schmalkuche.
- 2. The parsonage was rented in May to the Peet Family. Hopefully when we are all back together face-to-face, we can meet the family! Many thanks to Brian Sherwood, Trustees Chair, for facilitating the process!
- 3. The Council decided to go forward with plans to reopen the church with several members of the Council volunteering to serve on the Reopening Task Force. The task force is currently making plans to physically prepare the church for weekly worship services following the guidelines of the NYAC and the State of Connecticut; as well as coordinating how our worship services will continue to be held virtually when the church does reopen.
