Word and Image: Martin Luther's Reformation at the Morgan Library and Museum

The Morgan Library and Museum is marking the historic anniversary of Martin Luther posting the Ninety-Five Theses to the church door in Wittenberg in 1517. *Word and Image: Martin Luther's Reformation* explores the evolution of his movement and its triumphant propagation in text and art.

Word and Image includes more than 90 objects, highlighted by one of six existing printed copies of the Ninety-Five Theses, and nearly 40 paintings, prints and drawings by the celebrated German Renaissance artist, Lucas Cranach the Elder. Also on view: Luther's manuscript draft of famous Old Testament translation, sculptor Conrad Meit's statues of Adam and Eve and over 30 of Luther's most important publications. The majority of the works are loaned from German museums and never exhibited in the US.

On Saturday, January 7, 2017, join us for a train ride (Metro North) to Morgan Library and Museum between 36th and 37th Street (short walk from Grand Central). Your cost will be your train ticket, \$20 museum entrance plus incidentals. All are welcome so please feel free to invite your friends and family!
