Introduction: Christ Jesus dies on the Cross to redeem mankind, to save us from our sins because of his love for us. As recorded in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John in the Holy Bible, Jesus Christ was mocked, scorned, and tortured in the praetorian. Condemned to death by Pontius Pilate, he carried his Cross from Jerusalem to Calvary, was nailed to the cross, and hung between two common criminals. He suffered and indescribable end, as recalled on Good Friday of Holy Week. Tonight, we reflect on the last seven expressions of Jesus Christ on the Cross recorded in scripture.

**The First Word:** "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do." Luke 23:34.

**The Second Word:** "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Luke 23:43

**The Sixth Word:** When Jesus had received the wine, he said, "It is finished;" and he bowed his head and handed over the spirit. John 19:30.


